# Ministry Satisfaction Survey Deadline Approaching:

The ministry satisfaction (gr. 4 & 7) parent survey

is open until **April 30**<sup>th</sup>. The results will provide important perceptions on how McGirr Elementary is doing in terms of student achievement and learning, safety and social responsibility, environmental education and health and fitness at school. Parents of grade **4** and **7** students may complete a survey for each child in each grade. Parent Logon numbers were given out in February. ### **Student Registration 2016-2017**

**Moving?** Please inform the office and your child's teacher *now* if you are moving and not returning to McGirr in September. This information is vital for us to accurately plan and staff the school for September 2016.

Kindergarten Registration- Our current in-catchment student numbers are lower than projected at 24 students. Please ensure that your child is registered at McGirr if this is his/her catchment area school. Also, please share this information with other parents and community members of children born in 2011 to register now (until June 15, 2016) if they wish to be included in our fall school organization. All out-of-catchment (OOC) students, including kindergarten, must register at their home/in-catchment school – even though they have an OOC application on file at another school. This is important in order to guarantee a secured space for your child in the in-catchment school if there is no room available at the OOC school.

## School Organization 2016-2017 Parent Letters

McGirr is currently staffed for 16 divisions for September 2016. If parents wish, they may write a letter to the principal to have the school based team consider parents' placement requests for the fall. Here are the criteria for all parent letters regarding student placement requests for the 2016-2017 school year. Letters must be addressed to Mr. Halfyard, Principal; not mention teacher names; be based on student learning strengths, needs and style and the learning environment; social-emotional considerations; history of blended classes; class composition and male-to-female ratio. All parent letters must be submitted to Mr. Halfyard by **May 31**st for consideration for September 2016. While we will consider parent letters it is important to recognize that we cannot honour all requests and the principal, in consultation with staff, is responsible for student placements.

On Tuesday, April 12 at 7 p.m., there will be a public meeting to gather input to aid in the development of a revised transportation policy for the 2017-18 school year. The intent of the meeting is to create guidelines the district should use to support students getting to school.

The meeting will take place in Chandler Hall at John Barsby Community School. No discussion of transportation for the 2016-17 year will take place.

Qualifying athletes will then compete in the district track and field meet on Thursday June 9<sup>th</sup>. Students will be given permission slips for the school (and zone and district) meet(s) and parents must sign the form and have students return it to their teacher if they wish to participate.

Students will travel to and from the Rotary Bowl by bus and all classroom teachers and education assistants from McGirr will be supervising them during the school meet.

Parent volunteers are required for timing of track events and we will need as many parents as possible Please sign the bottom of the permission slip (*coming in May*) to indicate that you are able to help with timing, officiating or judging events. Thank you very much in advance to all staff and parents who will help to make the McGirr school track meet a success.
