Registration for September 2016

Kindergarten Students- Children who will be five years of age before January 1, 2017, may enter school in September 2016. You may defer your child's enrolment until September 2017. There are currently more out-of-catchment applications than in-catchment registrations. If you know anyone with kindergarten age children please remind them to register now in order to ensure a space for September!

Parents are encouraged to register their children at their neighborhood (catchment) school as soon as you can. Please bring your child's birth certificate and proof of address. To obtain an assured space in your child's catchment area school you must register by June 15^{th} , 2016.

Out-of-Catchment (OOC) Applications- The application process starts Monday, January 4th, 2016 and ends Thursday, March 31st, 2016. Parents complete an application form for the school they wish their child to attend. Opportunities for OOC placements are limited. Priority is given to those who have a sibling already registered at the requested school. All other requests will be considered in the order in which they are received, and acceptance is subject to available spaces and facilities and staffing.
