PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Plappy 2016! Welcome back to all of our returning and new students and families to McGirr for an exciting second half to the 2015-16 school year. Our staff is working hard to provide a quality educational experience for every student. A New Year begins and a new provincial curriculum unfolds. On Friday January 29th educators from across our district will be learning together at Dover Bay for the first of two curriculum development days. The curriculum model is made up of three elements: Content (What students are expected to KNOW), Curricular Competencies (What students are expected to DO), and Big Ideas (What students are expected to UNDERSTAND). Teachers will combine the three elements in ways they see fit to personalize learning in their classrooms. Please visit https://curriculum.gov.bc.ca/ for details on our new curriculum.

Foundation Skills Assessments for all grade 4 and 7 students in the province. These are annual assessments in reading comprehension, writing, and numeracy sponsored by the ministry of education in schools across the province. Students in grade 4 and 7 at McGirr will be completing both online and booklet FSA components from **January 11**- **February 19**th. Results do not impact student report cards and will sent home by April 30th. The ministry is currently developing a new form of provincial student assessment in these core subjects which will be piloted next year.

Ministry of education Satisfaction Surveys are now open and will continue until April 30th. These surveys are for students in grade 4,7,10, and 12, their parents and staff. A parent may complete a survey for each child in the targeted grades. Responses are anonymous and are important to help us to focus on improvements, to build on strengths, and to develop clear and sustainable school goals for the future. Next week we will send all parents of grade 4 and 7 students a letter with the link, and a unique logon number attached which will enable you to complete the online survey in 5-10 minutes. The logon number cannot be linked to any individual. I am hoping that 50-60% of parents will complete the survey!

The Sexual Health Education lessons presented by **Kerri Isham** are concluding this Friday. Ms. Isham taught each of our classes from K-7 over the past two weeks. As mentioned in the December newsletter this information is a part of the provincial curriculum and Ms. Isham is an experienced and qualified teacher. I participated in the parent evening on December 10th and also sat in on many of the intermediate sessions. Please feel free to contact me or Kerri if you have any questions or concerns regarding the lessons and/or any of the subject matter of the sessions.

My office door is often open and I encourage all parents and guardians to visit the office and discuss any issues or concerns that you may have regarding your child's education. You may also wish to email me or contact Ms. Hiltz in the office to arrange an appointment. Thank you for your support.

Student Registration for September 2016

Started Monday, January 4th, 2016

New Registrations- If this is the first time you have registered your child in a Nanaimo-Ladysmith School, you must bring the following documents with you:

- Your child's birth certificate
- Proof of your address. This can be a credit card statement, utility bill, mortgage statement, municipal tax bill, or rental agreement with your name and address, or a notary-authorized letter.

Kindergarten Students- Children who will be five years of age before January 1, 2017, may enter school in September 2016. You may defer your child's enrolment until September 2017.

Parents are encouraged to register their children at their neighborhood (catchment) school as soon as you can. Please bring your child's birth certificate and proof of address. To obtain an assured space in your child's catchment area school you must register by June 15th, 2016.

Out-of-Catchment (OOC) Applications- The application process starts Monday, January 4th, 2016 and ends Thursday, March 31st, 2016. Parents complete an application form for the school they wish their child to attend. Opportunities for OOC placements are limited. Priority is given to those who have a sibling already registered at the requested school. All other requests will be considered in the order in which they are received, and acceptance is subject to available spaces and facilities and staffing.
