PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

New Ways of Teaching /Learning and Assessing/Evaluating

K-7 at McGirr 2016-2017

The BC Education Plan is moving toward educational choice and flexibility with less focus on facts and more on concepts and competencies. At McGirr, Teachers will be guiding and empowering learners who will engage in discovery, creativity and problem-solving. While exemplary instructional and assessment practice has been happening and will continue, we will move towards a more personalized, flexible teaching and learning method that reflects a 21st century world.

Teachers will continue to reshape their instructional practices and identify more effective ways of student assessment and evaluation. We are shifting from a model of reporting to parents at three formal times each year, to one of ongoing communication with parents throughout the year. This involves fluid processes and changes in how teachers assess, and also how we communicate student learning to both students and parents.

Below is a list of teaching delivery methods. It incorporates the redesigned curriculum, how students access and understand the new curriculum, and how teachers communicate student learning.

Current/future:

Learning occurring in all environments at all times.

Learners collaborating and sharing their understandings with others.

Student-centered: teacher is the 'guide on the side' while facilitating, coaching and being the lead learner.

Multiple opportunities for students to express and pursue interests and make learning choices.

Assessments provide accurate information about the student's learning and proficiency levels. Evaluation is forward-looking.

Ongoing self, peer, and teacher formative assessments that are authentic and communicated with parents; a minimum of 2+ communications of student learning in core subjects for 2016-17.

Teachers, students and parents are partners in providing timely and responsive ongoing descriptive feedback of student learning during the year.

Curriculum is connected to student's passions, curiosity, interests, experiences and talents and the real world.

Two written Reports: (end of January "snapshot" and Summative in June for 2016-2017).
