

INTRODUCTION TO LEARNING

We are excited to announce a new "Pilot Project" this year that will be used in formal (face to face) communication of learning with parents.

Our first session takes place in October and the second session in March. With COVID measures it is not quite what we had envisioned, but we hope we will be able to pull it off.

Our October session is an "Introduction to Learning," and our March session will be "Ongoing Communication of Learning."

All of the dates are listed in the calendar dates and please note the four early dismissals (two in October and two in March).

There will be an online tool used for you to sign up for a session and teachers plan to send this information out by Friday October 8th (and possibly early the following week if the technology does not agree with us (3))

We are excited about this change in practice for this year.

STUDENT VERIFICATION FORMS+ NEIGHBOURHOOD FIELD TRIP FORM

Please look for these important forms that ended up being sent home as hard copy on paper.

We ask that you review all the pages and return them to school as quickly as possible so that we have the necessary safety contacts and medical information on file for your child. It is very important that we have alternate phone numbers to call in case your child is sick, or there is an emergency.

VOLUNTEER AND CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS

We hope (soon) parents will be able to volunteer in classrooms. In fact, with some outdoor fieldtrips this has already started.

When volunteering to help support a class or function or activity school related, you must complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC)

 Criminal Record Check (CRC) is completed every 5 years.

In terms of the CRC, we suggest completing it when your child is in Kindergarten (or when your child starts McGirr) and in Grade 4. That will cover all of your years at McGirr. Your CRC must be done on-line:

The process above can take up to 3 weeks to finalize. Actually doing it on line will take about 5-10 minutes for most adults and you are encouraged to do this when your child starts Kindergarten (or their first year here) and again at the start of Grade 4 (the check is good for 5 years). This will ensure you are covered for all 8 years at McGirr.

PHOTO DAY (RETAKE DAY) WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 27

- For ordering purposes, proofs for all students photographed on September 29th will be provided to each child/family before the retake date.
- The photographer asks: parents who want a retake (time will be announced closer to the date), to return their original proofs to the photographer. **Please do not return the proof envelope to the school**. The photographer would like the students to physically hand their original proofs directly to them.
- If a student was absent on the original photo day, then they would have their picture taken on the retake day.

HALLOWEEN ACTIVITIES

Our theme day on Friday October 29th is wear Orange and Black to school.



For those families who decide to send their child in a costume, here are a few words about Halloween costumes:

Since we are a school, and a school that has children as young as 4 years old, we ask that parents and students keep this in mind when preparing costumes to be worn at school. Costumes should not have guns, swords (weapons of any kind) nor excessive gore.

Our school dress code still applies even on Halloween. This is one of those things that we ask for parents and students to use good judgment and to pick costumes that respect the viewer and the wearer.

Additionally, students have two recess breaks and many transitions and up and down at carpet times and use of the washroom during the day. There is a good chance the costume your child came in will not be in the same condition your child will leave in at the end of the day (and this can cause a lot of "upsetness" with the younger kids).
