

FROM THE OFFICE

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

These past 5 weeks or so have been busy getting school started but we are settled in thanks to the hard work of staff at the school, as well as our students, district staff, parents/caregivers etc... It truly takes a small village to get things up and running.

I am impressed by the hard work of staff with respect to the transition of our 46 Kindergarten students and over 35 new Grade 1-7 students. Many thanks to the staff working with these students as well as to our parents/caregivers in transitioning these students to McGirr.

We have had many practice drills. These drills are very important both for the students and for the adults. Please feel free to prepare your children for these much-needed practice drills. The Great BC Shakeout (earthquake drill) is coming up this month as well.

A reminder early dismissal week (1 PM) is coming up (Mon Oct 21-Thurs Oct 24). Please ensure caregivers/daycare/pick up people are informed. Pick up every day that week will be 1 PM (note no school on Friday October 25th due to a Provincial Professional Development Day.

The early dismissals are tied in with our Introduction to Learning Sessions that will take place on Wednesday October 23rd. There will be an online tool used to book these in person sessions. Teachers (if technology cooperates with us) will email out the links on Wednesday October 16th (later in the day, most likely by 5 pm)

On a different note, (even with our sunny weather many mornings) the wet (and possibly cold) weather will be arriving soon (with wind as well) (3). Please ensure your child has a change of clothes (including socks, etc...) in their backpacks. This saves having to bother caregivers at home or work during the school day.

Working together reaps the most rewards for your child, it truly does take a village to raise a child. All of us want the best for your child. Home and school, working together is key in achieving the greatest results.

VOLUNTEER AND CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS

Detailed information has been sent out many times and is routinely sent out on our listserve.

When volunteering to help support a class or function or activity school related, you must complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC)

• Criminal Record Check (CRC) is completed every 5 years.

In terms of the CRC, we suggest completing it when your child is in Kindergarten (or when your child starts McGirr) and in Grade 4. That will cover all of your years at McGirr. Your CRC must be done on-line:

The process above can take up to 3 weeks to finalize. Actually doing it on line will take about 5-10 minutes for most adults and you are encouraged to do this when your child starts Kindergarten (or their first year here) and again at the start of Grade 4 (the check is good for 5 years). This will ensure you are covered for all 8 years at McGirr.

- Non Emergency Early pick up: email info.mg@sd68.bc.ca (also copied to your child's teacher) as early as possible (on the day of) so we can ensure your child's teacher is aware. (include your child's first/last name and time of pick up).
- <u>Non-Emergency Pick up at end of day</u> (1:50--2:10). We are a large school, with a busy parking lot, and students are not

always in their assigned classrooms towards the end of the day. From gym, to library, to outside PE, buddies, music, band, support rooms, the list goes on, so this email is a crucial part in allowing us to have the time to have your child ready as quickly as possible. If you are showing up without this notice, there will be a longer wait. If requesting non-emergency early dismissal close to the end of the day bell (ie 1:50-2:10) please ensure you have given the office good lead time.. In an ideal day, students would not need to leave early during that last part of the day.

HALLOWEEN ACTIVITIES

Our theme day on October 31st is wear Orange and Black to school.



For those families who decide to send their child in a costume, here are a few words about Halloween costumes:

Since we are a school, and a school that has children as young as 4 years old, we ask families and students keep this in mind when preparing costumes to be worn at school.

Costumes should not include:

- Masks that obscure the students face (This is for safety reasons when traveling around the school—and stairs outside--and for identification purposes)
- guns, swords (weapons of any kind) nor excessive gore.

Our school dress code still applies even on Halloween. This is one of those things that we ask for parents and students to use good judgment and to pick costumes that respect the viewer and the wearer.

Additionally, students have two recess breaks and many transitions and up and down at carpet times and use of the washroom during the day. There is a good chance the costume your child came in will not be in the same condition your child will leave in at the end of the day (and this can cause a lot of "upsetness" with the younger kids).

PHOTO DAY (RETAKE DAY) MONDAY OCT 28

• For ordering purposes, proofs for all students photographed in September will be provided to each child/family before the retake date.

• The photographer asks: parents who want a retake (exact time will be announced closer to the date), to return their original proofs to the photographer. **Please do not return the proof envelope to the school**. The photographer would like the students to physically hand their original proofs directly to them.

• If a student was absent on the original photo day, then they would have their picture taken on the retake day.
